From the Pastor...

Walking with Jesus: Parables and Practices for Lent



With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; he did not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything in private to his disciples. Mark 4: 33-34

On Sabbatical in April 2009, I experienced the gift of a lifetime: a tour of Israel and Jordan. A part of that tour took us to cities in the Decapolis where we walked amidst old Roman ruins and places where Jesus walked. To walk those dirt paths was a profound experience for me and I paced the same earth where Jesus had walked, rested, taught, preached and prayed. Very quickly on the tour, I realized the immense imagery Jesus used in his teachings. I turned a corner around the ruins one day and saw a huge field of wild day lilies. Instantly the words of Jesus came to me: "Do not worry: look at the lilies of the filed, they neither toil nor spin..." (Mt 6:28). With regular frequency I beheld the everyday images Jesus used for his sermons and teachings—the rocks beside the roads, mustard seeds, birds, pottery, children playing, the fishing boats on Galilee. It was like all I'd learned in seminary and life was right before me in three dimensions! I thought, HA! Jesus used the everyday surroundings for his sermons! His parables and teachings were at the tips of his fingers and in the center of his eye. I can see why people loved to follow him—he wove faith right into the daily sights and experiences they encountered!

Today, do we recognize these important lessons of faith in the midst of our daily living? In answer to that I have developed our Lenten focus on Jesus'

Parables and Spiritual Practices. I will preach on the parables and include in our worship time opportunities to experience and reflect on the most basic spiritual practices that can help us grow daily in our relationship with our Lord. Below is a list of those Sundays, the Parables and Spiritual Practices we will look at together. If you have a story of a modern parable you have experienced, I would love to hear about it and perhaps share it with others!

Mar 17—Jesus = Spiritual but not religious: The Good Shepherd/Breath Prayers

Mar 24—God never gives up on us!/Prodigal Child/Imaging Prayer



Adult Education Forum



The discussion will examine facts about gun ownership and violence in the USA, the situation in Rochester, the position of the Presbyterian Church (USA), and whether our congregation should take a stand on these issues.

February 24, Pastor Teresa plans to lead a 3 week Sunday a.m. study on the materials she received from her Synod School Course in 2012 on the current breakthroughs in Neuroscience and our faith. She also plans to reflect on the current #1 NY Times Non-fiction Bestseller, PROOF OF HEAVEN, by Eben Alexander. (Regularly \$15.99, now available for \$10 at



Costco.) The class will explore the topics of near death experiences, Celtic "thin places," and research on how our brains are wired for faith and spiritual practices.
