Musings from Pastor Laurene

Lent is a wonderful opportunity to focus on our own spirituality and faith. It is a time of preparing our hearts and minds for the celebration of the Risen Jesus Easter morning. Using the spiritual practices of prayer, meditation and fasting and intentionally taking the time each of the 40 days to reflect on our own spiritual lives, we can discover what is life-giving as well as identify the practices, attitudes and activities that keep us from fully experiencing God's

spirit. It is a season of renewal as we come to know God more deeply and intimately. This renewal impacts the sense of who we are, how we are in relationship with others and how we experience our faith corporately.

Lent can be seen as a time of letting go, of abstaining from something, or of sadness as we contemplate the sacrifice of Jesus. The Lenten practice of giving up something has its roots in the early church with the practice of fasting and prayer for the 40 days prior to Easter.

The importance of 40 days is found in scripture. Moses, prior to receiving the 10 commandments on Mt Sinai, went without food and water for 40 days in preparation. (Exodus 34:28) and Elijah, walked 40 days and night to the mountain of God, Mt Horeb, also known as Mt. Sinai (I Kings 19:8), and Jesus fasted and prayed in the wilderness for 40 days before beginning his public ministry (Matthew 4:2). This concept of fasting over the centuries evolved from a complete fast to the practice of giving up meat on Fridays for Lent.

As we begin this Lenten journey together, let be mindful of the spiritual opportunity this time affords us. We as Presbyterians are not mandated or required to practice Lent in a specific manner. It is truly shaped by the intent and desire of each person. Some people choose to give up a food item or habit, some choose to take on a practice such as dedicating specific hours to volunteering or even, a practice that benefits their own spiritual and physical health. Regardless the choice, the intention is spiritual transformation.

Lent also holds the hope in our part of the world of spring. The mounds of snow and ice giving away to warmth, renewal, new growth, flowers and color. Lent prepares us for new life in Christ and the new life we experience in and through this community of faith. May our hearts and minds be ready to receive the renewing warmth of God in Jesus Christ who walks with us every day!

The Mission Committee has met and determined that the mission focus for this year will be mainly on hunger issues. CPC has supported the Channel One Gardens for 2 years and will again support the gardens by paying the costs of tilling the land and supplying water for the garden. It is a joy to see the gardens grow each year and to see the gardeners hard at work producing produce to help them meet their family food needs and provide healthy food for their families.

Channel One has thanked us on behalf of the gardeners many times. Here are the comments from last spring. "Last year (2012), all of the lots were full. We had 3 new families start last spring. With how our weather started in the spring (with a blizzard in May) the plots got started later, and with a much shorter growing season. The plots were productive, but not like they have been in the past."

If you are near the gardens this year (and there will be gardens), please take time to greet the gardeners. You might even offer to help them weed.

NOON MEAL

The next Noon Meal is April 12. The sign up sheet will be in the Narthex March 16. We need cooks and servers. Come if you haven't come before and those who have come before please come again.

BACKPACK PROGRAM

We are continuing to support the backpack program through Channel One. Please check out Stacy's article in this newsletter on what is being done. Part of the Mission funds will be used to purchase fruit and other special needs throughout the year. Thanks to all who help with the backpacks.

SOUPER BOWL SUNDAY

Souper Bowl Sunday 2014 was such a success, even though the Denver Broncos were not at their best. You donated 318 cans of soup, a new record. The Spirit Award was given to the youth

who collected 172 cans. Thanks to Denise and Jennifer, our cheerleaders who kept the cans a' coming.

AIFC

We will continue to contribute to the AIFC through Goodness in a Pack later this year. In the meantime, look for sales on toothpaste, toiletries, socks and mittens and other items. We will provide a box to collect those items. We will be putting a list together shortly. The need of these families is great and the gratitude that they have for what we give them is far greater. We are thinking of taking a group of CPC'ers up to see the center during the summer.

CROP Walk

The CROP Walk will be on Oct. 5 in the afternoon. We have participated in this for over 15 years. It raises funds for both Channel One and Church World Mission. That is another way we will be helping those who hunger both here and around the world. Last year, we had walkers from age 9 and up, raising \$360.00. This year, we will raise even more money and have many more CPC Walkers. Pastor Laurene will be joining the CROP Walk Steering Committee and helping us expand our efforts in this area. More details will follow, but mark this on your calendars now.

NAMI

We have decided not to participate as a church in the NAMI Walk this year as it occurs at the same time as the CROP Walk that we have long supported. We encourage anyone who wants to walk in the NAMI Walk to do so and to contribute to NAMI. Everyone is touched by mental illness in some way. It is an excellent program in our community. Tammy Rider is very active in the program.






