

SCRIPTURE READING

Isaiah 58:6-9

Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice,

to remove the knee from the neck of the poor,

to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?

Is it not to share your bread with the hungry,

to bring the homeless ones into your house;

when you see the naked, to cover them,

and not to hide yourself from your own kin?

Then your light shall break forth like the dawn,

and your healing shall spring up quickly;

your advocate shall go before you,

the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard.

Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer;

you shall cry for help, and God will say, Here I am.

RESPONSIVE READING adapted from PSALM 116 I love my God, who has heard my voice and listened to my prayer, Who has not betrayed my trust:

**Therefore, I will call on my God as long as I live.** When fear was all around, and grief quenched my spirit, I suffered distress and anguish.

Then I called, "Holy One, save my life!" Our God is gracious and righteous, full of tender love. When I was lost and despairing, the Beloved saved me.

**Be at rest, O my soul; be at peace,** For God has delivered my soul from death, my eyes from tears, my feet from stumbling. How can I show my gratitude for all I have received?

**I will call on the name of God, who helps me;** Remember your love for all you have made, Your grief for those who suffer and die.

SCRIPTURE LESSON

Romans 5:1-8

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, we are given this grace in which we stand. We boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God.

And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings,

for suffering produces endurance,

and endurance produces character,

and character produces hope,

and hope does not disappoint us,

because God's love has been poured into our hearts

through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

For while we were still missing the mark,

at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, hardly ever will anyone die for a righteous person though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die.

But God proves his love for us in this way:

while we still were sinners Christ died for us.


GOSPEL READING Matthew 9:35-10:1, 5-10 Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness.... "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment. Take no gold, or silver, or copper in your belts, no bag for your journey, or two tunics, or sandals, or a staff; for laborers deserve their food.

Keep these words in your heart. The Lord is our God, the Lord alone.
