SCRIPTURE READING

Isaiah 44:6-9

Thus says the Lord, the ruler of Israel, and the Redeemer, Lord of hosts: I am the first and I am the last; besides me there is no god.

Who is like me? Let them proclaim it, let them declare and set it forth before me. Who has announced from of old the things to come? Let them tell us what is yet to be.

Do not fear, or be afraid; have I not told you from of old and declared it? You are my witnesses! Is there any god besides me? There is no other rock; I know not one.

#### RESPONSIVE READING

PSALM 86:11-17

Teach me your way, my God, my guide, so that I walk in your truth; give me an undivided heart to honor your name.

I give thanks to you, O Beloved, with my whole heart;

I will glorify your name forever.

For great is your steadfast love toward me; you have delivered my soul from the depths of despair. The insolent rise up against me; ruffians seek my life: they do not attend to your will and your way.

But you, my Beloved, are merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness. Turn to me and be gracious to me; give me your strength;

Save me, for I long to serve you as my parents did.

#### GOSPEL READING

Matthew 13:24-30; 36-43

After explaining the parable of the sower and the good soil, Jesus put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away. So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' The slaves said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' But he replied, 'No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn."

Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples approached him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; the field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen!"

Keep these words in your heart. The Lord is our God, the Lord alone.



#### A LITANY OF GIFTS

As in one body we have many parts and each part has its own function, so all of us together with Christ are one body, and we all belong to each other.

We have different gifts according to the grace God has given us.

Based on Rom. 12:4-8, 11-13

If your gift is to hear God's Word, speak it out in faith.

If your gift is service, live to serve others.

If your gift is the heart of a teacher, teach what is true.

Let preachers preach with conviction, and givers give freely; let officers work diligently for the people, and let those who serve the poor, serve gladly.

Let us not lack for enthusiasm, but be ardent in spirit, serving the Lord, rejoicing in hope, patient in suffering, constant in prayer, supporting one another, and welcoming all.

### STATEMENT ON THE MISSION OF THE CHURCH

*Leader*: The mission of God in Christ gives shape and substance Book of Order F-1.01 to the life and work of the Church.

In Christ, the Church participates in God's mission for the transformation of creation and humanity by proclaiming to all people the good news of God's love, offering to all people the grace of God at font and table, and calling all people to discipleship in Christ.

The ministry of the church is shared by pastor and people, so that all together may fulfill the mission to which we are called in Jesus Christ.

The particular responsibility of the ministry of a teaching elder is to build up the church and serve the people of God, so that the Word may be rightly proclaimed and the sacraments rightly celebrated.

The Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area acknowledges the role and place of the Rev. Jan Wiersma as stated supply pastor of Community Presbyterian Church in Rochester

We remember with joy our common calling to serve Christ, and we celebrate God's call to our sister, to serve among us as pastor.

## **QUESTIONS OF PUBLIC COMMITMENT**

*Leader:* While the usual constitutional questions asked of a person being installed as pastor of a congregation are not required for the form of service Jan undertakes, most are still relevant to the ministry which you will do here. And so Jan, I would ask you, before this congregation, to answer publicly these questions, as a means to name your commitment to ministry here:

Do you trust in the Lord Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? *I do.* 

Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you? *I do*.

Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit? *I will*.

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world? *I will*.

Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love? *I will*.

In the same way, the congregation too can publicly affirm your commitment to this pastoral relationship:

A ruling elder of the church addresses the congregation: Do we, the members of the church, accept Jan Wiersma as our pastor, chosen by God to guide us in the way of Jesus Christ? **We do.** 

Do we agree to pray for her, encourage her, to listen as she preaches, welcome her pastoral care, and honor her authority, as she seeks to honor and obey Jesus Christ our Lord? We do and we will.
