

SCRIPTURE READINGRomans 8:26-39The Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness.We don't really know how to pray as we should,and so the Spirit prays within us with sighs too deep for words.

And God, who searches the heart, knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit prays for the saints according to the will of God. We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, for those who are called according to God's purpose.

If God is for us, who can be against us? If God did not withhold even the Son, but gave him up for all of us, we can be sure that God will also give us everything else we need. Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who clears our name, so who can condemn us? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who sits at the right hand of God, who surely prays for us.

For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GOSPEL READING

Matthew 13:31-33, 44-52

After the parable of the weeds and the wheat, Jesus put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened."

And Jesus told them still more parables: "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it. "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind; when it was full, they drew it ashore, sat down, and put the good into baskets but threw out the bad. So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous and throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. "Have you understood all this?" They answered, "Yes." And he said to them, "Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old."

Keep these words in your heart. The Lord is our God, the Lord alone.


