SCRIPTURE READING

1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have
anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will
come like a thief in the night. When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden
destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there
will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a
thief; for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of
darkness.

So then let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; for those
who sleep sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. But since we belong

to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him.

Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.

But the one who had received the one talent went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master’s money. After a long time the master of those slaves came and settled accounts with them. Then the one who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five more talents, saying, ‘Master, you handed over to me five talents; see, I have made five more talents.’ His master said to him, ‘Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.’ And the one with the two talents also came forward, saying, ‘Master, you handed over to me two talents; see, I have made two more talents.’ His master said to him, ‘Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into

the joy of your master.' Then the one who had received the one talent also came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter seed; so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours.' But his master replied, 'You wicked and lazy slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

Keep these words in your heart. The Lord is our God, the Lord alone.

As a Matthew 25 church, we confess: In spite of divisions, inequities, and conflicting sources of information, we affirm the abiding truth of Jesus rather than the partial and short-lived truths we hear of in the world.

It is not true that this world and its inhabitants are doomed to die and be lost;

This is true: For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him shall not perish, but have everlasting life.

It is not true that we must accept inhumanity and discrimination, hunger and poverty, death and destruction;

This is true: I have come that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

It is not true that violence and hatred, war and destruction shall have the last word, and that one race shall forever claim supremacy over all others;

This is true: For to us a child is born, to us a Son is given, in whom authority will rest, and whose name will be Prince of Peace.

It is not true that we are simply victims of tyrannical leaders or dupes of the powers seeking to rule the world;

This is true: to me is given all authority in heaven and on earth, and lo, I am with you always, to the end of the world.

It is not true that we have to wait for those who are specially gifted, who are called prophets and leaders, before we can do anything;

This is true: I will pour out my Spirit on all people, Your sons and daughters shall prophesy, your young people share visions, and your old folk shall dream dreams.

It is not true that our dreams of the liberation of all, our dreams of justice, of human dignity, of peace, are not meant for this earth and its history;

The hour comes and it is now, that true worshippers shall worship God in spirit and in truth.

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Matthew 25 Sermon Series


