SCRIPTURE READING Genesis 17:1-7, 15-17

Last week, we learned about God's first covenant with humankind, the promise made to Noah and to all living things on earth never again to destroy the world with a flood. Here is the second great covenant.

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, "As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name

shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you.

God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her." Then Abraham fell on his face and laughed, and said to himself, "Can a child be born to a man who is a hundred years old? Can Sarah, who is ninety years old, bear a child?"

RESPONSIVE READING

Psalm 22:23-31

You who are in wonder of the Mystery, give praise!

Our loving Creator does not turn from those in trouble,
and does not hide from them; their cries are heard.

Our prayers rise up to heaven, for you, O God, will listen.

We lift our hearts to you; we lift our voices,

SCRIPTURE READING

Romans 4:13, 18-22

Paul, the author of the letter to the Romans, frequently referred back to early days of biblical history to prove his point. Here, he points to Abraham, who is regarded historically as the originator of three faith traditions known as Abrahamic: Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.

For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith.... Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become “the father of many nations,” according to what was said, “So numerous shall your descendants be.” He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah’s womb. No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. Therefore his faith “was reckoned to him as righteousness.”

GOSPEL READING

Mark 8:31-38

Peter has just made a giant leap of faith and identified Jesus, his teacher and friend, as the long-expected Messiah. Then Peter proceeds to ... fall on his face.

Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, “Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.”

He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, “If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.”

We proclaim Christ crucified - the wisdom and the power of God. **Thanks be to God.**


