Birds sing to us like friends.


Rivers flow with tears of joy.

RESPONSIVE READING

Genesis 1:1-25

In the beginning when God began creating the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters.

Then God said.

'Let there be light.'

And there was light

And God saw that the light was good.

God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

And God said,

'Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters.'

And it was so. God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

And God said,

'Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear.'

And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas.

And God saw that it was good.

Then God said,

'Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it.'

And God saw that it was good.

And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.

And God said,'


