

We belong to you.


Christ, you prepare a place for us and come for us and take us into yourself.

We come to you.


We are in you, and you are in us; we are one body.

LISTENING FOR GOD'S WORD

PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION

Gracious God, you have given us your Word in Creation, and in Scripture. You speak your living Word to us in our hearts, and in the presence of the risen Christ with us. Help us to listen, to hear, and to be made anew. Amen.

SCRIPTURE READING Acts 7.55-60

Stephen was not only the first martyr but one of the first deacons in the early church. He is described as being "a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, grace and power," who did great signs and wonders. But it was his unashamed preaching of the truth of Jesus that aroused the wrath of his own people. Before his final sermon recounting the history of salvation, they saw that "his face was like the face of an angel."

But filled with the Holy Spirit, Stephen gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. 'Look,' he said, 'I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!' But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.' Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, 'Lord, do not hold this sin against them.' When he had said this, he died.

from Psalm 31

In you, O Beloved, I seek refuge; do not let me ever be put to shame;

in your righteousness deliver me.

Incline your ear to me; rescue me speedily.

Be a rock of refuge for me, a strong fortress to save me.

You are indeed my rock and my fortress; for your name's sake lead me and guide me,

take me out of the net that is hidden for me, for you are my refuge.

you have redeemed me, my salvation, my faithful God.

SCRIPTURE READING

1 Peter 2.2-10

Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation— if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture:

'See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.'

To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner,'

and, 'A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall.'

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

It is good and beautiful to give God our praise.


Loving God, at your table Christ prepares a place for us.

and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.


For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever. Amen.


THE BREAD AND CUP ARE SHARED

vs. 1 & 3








PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION
