
#### THE LORD'S PRAYER



# My farewell gift to you

Today marks my fourth, and potentially final, retirement. You have been a wonderful congregation to close my official career! I'm sad to leave but hopeful for the renewal in your future.

Symbolizing my faith in God's purpose for you and my trust in your ongoing vitality, a number of new plants have been prepared as a gift for you. I hope you'll all take one (or several); or, if you can't take a plant, try a book for spiritual growth.

All of the plants were propagated from my indoor and outdoor gardens by dividing potbound monsters, rooting slips, or digging up volunteers. Like plants, churches grow by dividing when necessary, sharing life, and encouraging volunteers.

Some of the plants are well-established; some are just putting out roots, and others are still deciding whether or not to stick around. Some are well-dressed in semi-permanent pots, while others come in pots leftover from bedding plants. Some look delicate, like the corydalis (lacy leaves and yellow flowers that bloom all summer) or butterfly weed, but

will quickly dominate your garden, if you're not careful. Some natives, like the coneflowers (*echinacea*) and brown-eyed Susans (*Rudbeckia triloba*), spread like weeds but butterflies adore them.

Indoor and outdoor plants are identified. Many of the indoor plants can live in sheltered outdoor spots in warmer months. Ask me if you have any questions! Happy growing!
