SCRIPTURE READING Romans 12:9-21

Rejoice in hope; be patient in affliction; persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; pursue hospitality to strangers.

GOSPEL READING Matthew 16:21-28



We thank you for your presence in our lives.


We thank you for the gift of salvation.

Today, we welcome Rev. Chris Miller to CPC. Rev. Chris Miller was born in Davenport, Iowa, and grew up in parsonages as a preacher's kid (PK). He graduated from Carthage College (BA, sociology, '71) and then spent three years as a parish youth worker in Appleton, Wisconsin. He attended the ELCA Lutheran seminary in Chicago (LSTC, '75–'79) and was ordained on March 25, 1979. Rev. Miller had served various parishes in Wisconsin, including Kenosha, Rice Lake / Brill, Mineral Point, and Loganville; also served parishes in Iowa City, IA, & Blue Springs, MO.

Rev. Miller retired after thirty-five years in active parish ministry, and 5 years of Interim pastoral work in the Southeast Minnesota Synod. He and his wife, Donna, moved to Rochester in July 2015. Since then he has done Interim work in 3 parishes, and supply preached in approximately 35 different churches in the ELCA's SE MN Synod.




