The Peace and Global Witness Offering will be collected Sunday, October 1, see page 3 for more information about that offering. Twenty-Five Percent of the offering will be shared locally. CPC has chosen the SE MN Interfaith Immigrant Legal Defense as our recipient this year.

The Southeastern Minnesota Interfaith Immigrant Legal Defense estimates that 7,800 people live in southeastern Minnesota without documentation.

More than half of Immigration and Customs Enforcement detained immigrants from southeastern Minnesota are not represented by attorneys.

People in detention who can't afford representation have a 3 percent chance of avoiding removal. By contrast, for those who get released from detention and who have legal representation, the success rate is 74 percent.

Community Presbyterian Church in Rochester will sponsor a program on legal defense for immigrants on Sunday, October 1, following worship. Leading the program will be Michael Resman and Phil Wheeler of the Southeastern Minnesota Interfaith Immigrant Legal Defense.

The organization, it said, "works not to evade immigrant laws but to ensure that immigration laws are followed."



Social Justice In the Community

Mary Alice and former pastor Jan Wiersma have been participating in a group in support of land recovery for Native Americans. Through this group, they also became involved with the Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery Coalition, a ministry of the Mennonites. That group is supporting the protection of a sacred Apache site in Arizona called Oak Flat. Rev. Jan Wiersma hopes to spend a month sometime in 2024, following training she received in Tucson iin September.

The Indigenous elders camping on the site to protect it have requested that people of all faiths and faith communities join them in Prayer-Rising for the protection of Oak Flat on Saturday, November 4. There will be an open house at CPC for people to come, share prayer, learn more about the situation on November 4th roughly paralleling the gathering at Oak Flat. **Mark your calendars!**

Prayer-Rising for Oak Flat

A Resolution Copper mine threatens to destroy Oak Flat. From the beginning of time, Apache Stronghold has grounded their resistance in the strength of their religious practice and spiritual relationship with the land.

Apache Stronghold asks people of other faiths to join them in this spiritual struggle. On November 4, Apache Stronghold will amplify these intercessions into a prayer-rising for the preservation of Oak Flat. Indigenous people will gather at Oak Flat to pray according to their ways. People of other faiths will also gather to encounter the Holy and to confront, through prayer, the forces of destruction brought by Resolution Copper.

Come pray with us at Oak Flat November 4! Prepare yourself in prayer and plan your transportation to this sacred site, located an hour east of Phoenix, Arizona. Or, organize prayers in your own community.


