

SCRIPTURE READING Romans 14:1-12

Welcome those who are weak in faith but not for the purpose of quarreling over opinions. Some believe in eating anything, while the weak eat only vegetables. Those who eat must not despise those who abstain, and those who abstain must not pass judgment on those who eat, for God has welcomed them. Who are you to pass judgment on slaves of another? It is before their own lord that they stand or fall. And they will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

Some judge one day to be better than another, while others judge all days to be alike. Let all be fully convinced in their own minds. Those who observe the day, observe it for the Lord. Also those who eat, eat for the Lord, since they give thanks to God, while those who abstain, abstain for the Lord and give thanks to God.

For we do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. For to this end Christ died and lived again, so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

Why do you pass judgment on your brother or sister? Or you, why do you despise your brother or sister? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God. For it is written,

"As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall give praise to God."

So then, each one of us will be held accountable.

GOSPEL READING

Matthew 18:21-35

Then Peter came and said to him, "Lord, if my brother or sister sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.

"For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him, and, as he could not pay, the lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions and payment to be made. So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' And out of pity for him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow slaves who owed him a hundred denarii, and seizing him by the throat he said, 'Pay what you owe.' Then his fellow slave fell down and pleaded with him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he would pay the debt. When his fellow slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. Should you not have had mercy on your fellow slave, as I had mercy on you?' 
BLESSING AND CHARGE


POSTLUDE

Join in on the discussion on September 17th! All are welcome, whether you've finished the book or not!









Peace and Global Witness Offering coming on October 1!

Jan Wiersma, former CPC pastor, has been accepted to attend a training session in Tucson, Ariz., Sept. 21-23.

The training will be led by the Community Peacemaker Teams and the Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery Coalition. Oak Flat is a portion of the Tonto National Forest east of Phoenix, Ariz. This is the original homeland of about 11 tribes of Apache people, who consider it a sacred site...

"The Apache Stronghold are individuals who come together in unity to battle continued colonization, defend holy sites and freedom of religion, and are dedicated to building a better community through neighborhood programs and civic engagement. We work from San Carlos, Ariz., connecting Apaches and other Native and non-Native allies from all over the world."

If Jan and the group leaders agree that spending a month in Oak Flat accompanying the Indigenous leaders would be a good fit for Jan, she will schedule that, too.

Participants encourage their supporters to contribute toward the \$2,000 cost of the training and the later stay at Oak Flat. Jan can pay this, plus my travel costs, from my own savings, but, as with any cause, donating gives people an incentive to learn about their investment.

Jan said: "If you feel so moved, I understand that you can make a tax-deductible contribution in this way: Go to the donation page for the coalition here: https://dismantlediscovery.org/donate/ and include the memo 'September '23 CPT training' for your donation."

"Again, if you want to know more about this situation and the urgency that has inspired them to request people of faith to accompany them in their nonviolent spiritual resistance to the "murder" of this ancient, sacred site, you can go to apache-stronghold.com and read about the situation or watch a number of brief but excellent videos," Jan said.
