



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Good day to you – and happy Lenten season, a time to reflect on our faith, our faith journey and the call that God has placed on our lives. During this third week of Lent our devotional has an article by Dr. Terence Lester that speaks about his life and Matthew 16:13-20.

In this article Dr. Lester asks us to "reflect on our own spiritual journeys and consider the seeds of revelation in our lives."

When has God shown up in our lives, when have we felt close



to God or noticed God? Have we had mountain top experiences? Have we professed our devotion to God? What has happened in our lives since then? What have we done with those moments?

During the fourth week Dr. Lester tells the story of a devastating car crash that caused him great pain, a long recovery and "left me grappling with my faith." The scripture lesson for week four is Matthew 16:21-23, Peter needs to learn to deal with a future no one wants to see. We all have to deal with hard truths we don't want to face. How has your faith gotten you through tough times?

Week five brings a beautiful story of a son's faith and a father returned to life through a son's faithful service to others. That's all I'm saying you'll have to pick up the devotional book or let us know you want one and I'll bring it to you. © The scripture for the week is Matthew 18:15-22. Forgiveness, reconciliation and healing are brought about by the grace of God. Who do you need to forgive?

Palm Sunday will be here before you know it – will you be ready? Will you be ready to sing "Hosanna" or will you be so busy getting ready for Easter that you miss this week altogether? This is a very busy time week for Jesus, and a confusing week for Peter – he has a very hard time getting it right and still he is loved – just like us. God's grace is more than our mistakes and given without strings attached. Each special day of this week has its own reading and question all are thought provoking.

Easter Sunday- What joy it can bring! Did you know that Easter is actually a six week season?? SIX WEEKS!! We get to celebrate Easter for six weeks! Can you tell that makes me happy? Man was I ripped off as a child – we only celebrated one week of Easter – our materials only give us 2 weeks of Easter, but it is really a 6 week season – because Jesus stuck around for 40 days, six weeks after his resurrection before he goes to heaven. If Jesus were here today, what would you tell him? What burning questions would you have to ask?

Easter is an attitude, a way of being in the world – a way of getting up in the morning and saying, "Today I choose Joy." It isn't an easy way to live sometimes, it isn't always the way you want to live – sometimes it feels good to be mad, and mad is ok as long as you don't live there. However, when you choose Joy as your daily attitude, when you chose Easter, the belief in the resurrected Christ, who loved You enough to die for you, life you chose to live a life of love, and that kind of life has all kinds of rewards the world can never take away.

Have you shared your answer to the Question of the Week? What is one thing at Community Presbyterian Church that is sacred to you? That one thing that you would not want changed. Please tell Pastor Carla, or email it to her, or write it down and put it in the offering plate.



ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING



In Isaiah 58, the prophet exclaims, "Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in" (Isaiah 58:12). As the people of Israel returned from the cloud of exile and struggled to rebuild their lives, Isaiah questioned their efforts: [Are you not called] "to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them?" (Isaiah 58:7).

Then in Matthew 25, we hear Jesus calling to us, "For I was hungry and you gave me food ... I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing. ... As you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:35–40).

Isaiah and Jesus are making an important theological point: faithfulness to God causes us to find solutions that will mend broken things—broken lives, broken spirits, broken hearts, broken relationships—things that happen to all of us throughout our lives.

When we give to the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) offering on Easter Sunday, we are combining our efforts with those across the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to repair peoples' lives — people who are hurting, broken, oppressed, lost or on the margins of society. The exact people about whom Isaiah and Jesus are speaking. The people we are called to connect with every day, but especially in the light of the Good News of the resurrection.

All are invited to visit the OGHS website (pcusa.org/oghs) to find all sorts of information on how donations help people all over the world and offer prayers for those who will receive monetary support through this offering. Small changes which, when added together here and around the globe, make huge differences in the lives of our siblings in need.

Make a donation to the One Great Hour of Sharing offering to benefit Presbyterian ministries to combat hunger, provide assistance after disaster strikes, and to work with sustainable community development on Sunday, March 31st.
