READING On Christ in Creation From Richard Rohr, *Daily Meditations*, April 24-25 Every resurrection story found in the Gospels affirms an ambiguous—yet certain—presence of the Risen Christ in very ordinary settings, like walking on the road to Emmaus with a stranger, roasting fish on the beach, or looking like a gardener to Mary Magdalene. These moments from Scripture set a stage of expectation and desire that God's Presence can be seen in the ordinary and the material, and we do not have to wait for supernatural apparitions. The core message of the incarnation of God in Jesus is that the Divine Presence is here, in us and in all of creation, and not only "over there" in some far-off realm. When Jesus spoke the words "This is my Body," I believe he was speaking not just about the bread right in front of him, but about the whole universe, about every thing that is physical, material, and yet also spirit-filled.

At Jesus' last earthly supper, after washing his disciples' feet, he leaves them with one final gift: love for one another.


