Let us learn what God has done for us all.


We have cried out to God and given praise with our tongues.

SCRIPTURE READING Deuteronomy 26: 1-11

When you come into the land which the Sovereign your God gives you for an inheritance, and have taken possession of it, and live in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which the Sovereign your God will choose, to make God's name to dwell there. And you shall go to the priest who is in office at the time, and say, "I declare this day to the Sovereign you God that I have come into the land which God swore to our ancestors to give us." Then the priest shall take the basket from your hand, and set it down before the altar of the Sovereign your God.

And you shall make response before the Sovereign your God. "A wandering Aramean was my father, who went down into Egypt and sojourned there, few in number; and there he became a nation, great, mighty and populous. And the Egyptians treated us harshly, and afflicted us, and laid upon us hard bondage. And behold, now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground, which you O Go have given to me." And you shall set it down before the Lord your God; and you shall rejoice in all the good which the Sovereign your God has given to you and to your house, you, and the Levite, and the resident alien who is among you.


